WISHING WELL FOOD PACKETS

After Thanksgiving last year we had an abundance of food left over after generously filling boxes for several families. 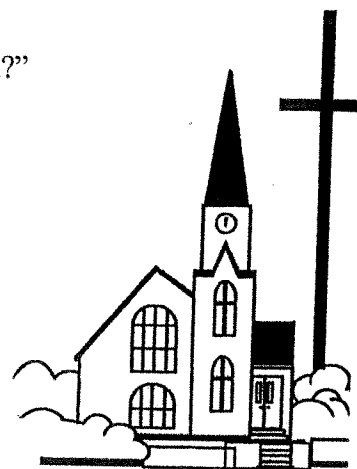
- Consider placing everything that might be needed for a single meal in a clear, 1-gallon, Ziploc type bag. These items should be shelf stable and not be in glass containers which are more likely to freeze and burst. Suggestions might be complete pancake mix and syrup, pasta and sauce, ready to make noodle dishes, soups, or a variety of canned fruits or vegetables.
- If the cans aren't pull-tab, maybe include a manual can opener.
- A recipe card is a nice touch. I am researching several options and may have cards available in the future. Stay tuned!

JANUARY/FEBRUARY SERMONS

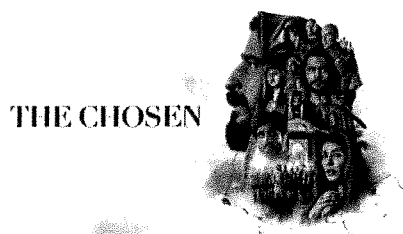
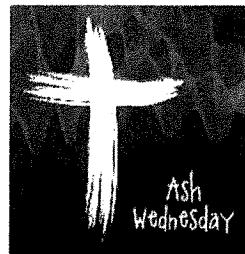

CHOSEN SEASON FIVE BEGINS WEDNESDAY JANUARY 28

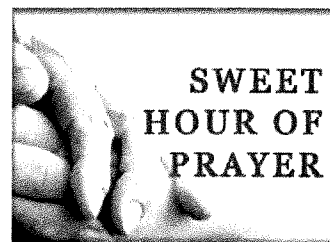

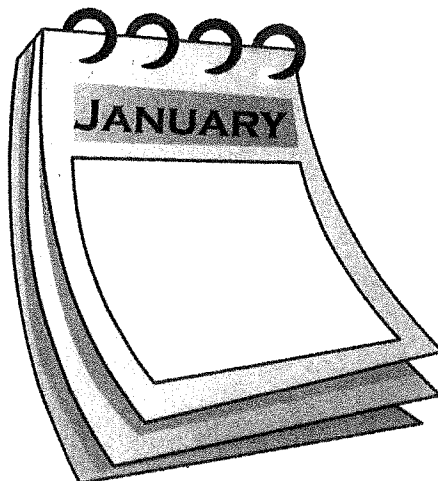
“A New Year”

If you know someone that might not

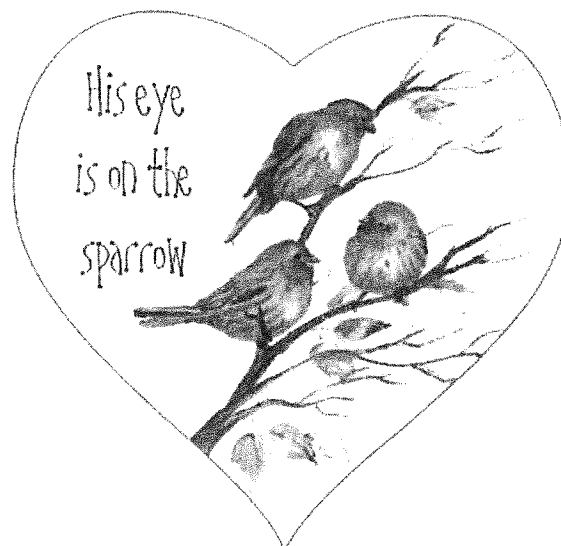
know Jesus, asking them to join in is a good way to share Him, and His light and His love with them.

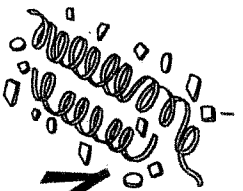

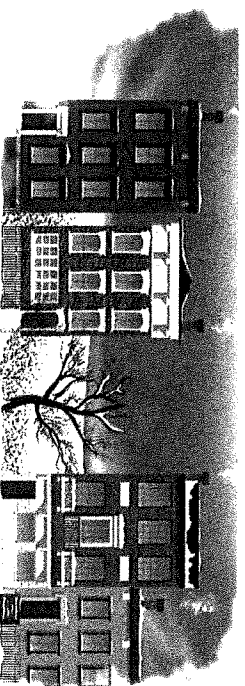

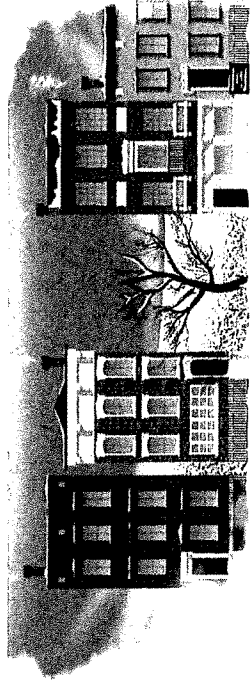
